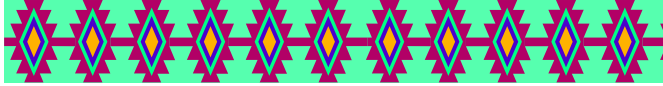

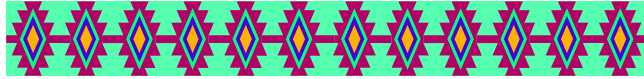

Flu Shots

- Are available at the Health Centre, pharmacy or from your Health Care Provider

Why Get a Flu Shot??

- By getting a Flu shot each year, it helps decrease your chance of getting sick with influenza (the flu)
- You also help prevent the spread of the Flu to others when getting your shot

Who Should Get a Flu Shot?

- Chronically Ill ... People who have
 - Diabetics
 - Immunosupressed
 - Cancer
 - Kidney Disease
 - Lung Disease
- Pregnant women
- The Elderly
- Health Care Workers
- Anyone 6 months or older who wants one



Herpes Zoster (Shingles)

For those between the ages of 65-70 years old, you are eligible for the shingles vaccine!

Pneumonia Shots

- Help protect against 23 types of pneumococci infection
- Are generally given once in a life time, but sometimes Health Care Providers recommend it more often for some people

Why Get a Pneumonia Shot??

- Help reduce the risk of becoming infected with pneumococci, which can cause pneumonia, sinus infections, ear infections, meningitis and blood infection

Who Should Get a Pneumonia Shot?

- All residents of nursing homes, homes for the aged & chronic care facilities
- All persons over the age of 65
- Individuals 2 years and older with a high risk medical condition
(including people with lung, heart or kidney disease, diabetes, cancer, organ transplant recipients & immune deficiency)

Td or Tdap

Remember your Td vaccine needs a booster every 10 years!

- Anyone included in the High Risk Eligibility

High Risk Eligibility

- People with chronic health conditions including:
 - diabetes
 - cancer
 - blood disorders
 - People who are over weight (BMI above 40)
 - lung, respiratory, kidney or heart disease
 - immunosuppressed
- Children and teens treated with acetylsalicylic acid for long periods of time
- People who live in long term care facilities, nursing homes or chronic care facilities
- People 65 years of age and older
- Pregnant women
- Children 6 months of age to 5 years of age
- Aboriginal Peoples
