Dawn Setford (Mary Francis Whiteman) is Onkwehonwe, Haudenosaunee, Kanien'kehá ka (Mohawk) whose familial territory is St.Regis/Akwesasne. She is a community-engaged visual and media artist who advocates for equality and facilitates the creation of informed opinions of Indigenous Culture.



Dawn is the founder and executive director of the Aboriginal Arts Collective of Canada and owner at Pass The Feather. She actively volunteers for the National Indigenous Survivors of Child Welfare committee as the creator of their logo, website and graphic designs. She is a regular contributor to Aboriginal Women's Economic Quarterly Indigenous, Spirit Magazine (Indigenous & Northern Affairs) and frequents retail spaces and powwow trail to market, educate and promote the hand made works of fine Indigenous artisans.

Feather Bundle workshops are infused with valuable lessons that reflect respect for others, respect for our land and the animals that we share it with. We explore the value of talking circles within our systems of work and education – how they teach trust, respect and co-operation. We also touch on sustainable hunting practice, ornithology and address intergenerational trauma as a result of the 60's scoop and residential school system.

This workshop initiative envisions a more respectful connection between Ontario's Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities by tapping into mutual interests despite different histories or ideologies. By recognizing mutual ground such as art and environment, we have an opportunity to create a reciprocal relationship and decrease the perceptions of inequality.

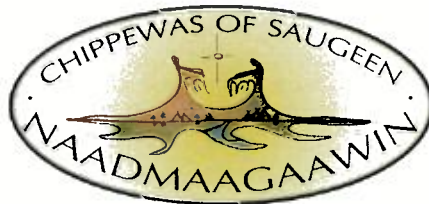

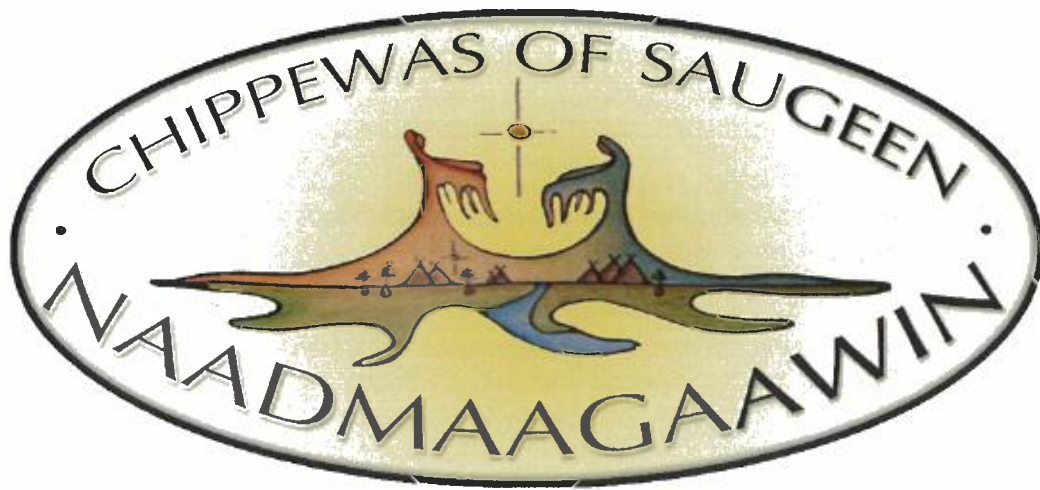

Tips for your Good Food Box

Once you get your Good Food Box home, you should start your prep work if possible.

Potatoes and apples keep in a dark cool spot.

Cut up (easier on blender when small chunks) store in a seal tight container or bag up to freeze apples, pears, bananas, peaches,

Cut up and wash and store in fridge in seal tight containers/ bags of carrots, celery, peppers.

Onions, celery and tomatoes cut in small pieces and freeze for spaghetti sauce later.

Don't keep apples and bananas together in fruit bowls, (bananas will brown faster if kept together.

Lettuce, cut the ends, wash and separate pieces and then place in wet paper towel in layers, keep in a seal tight container, this will keep ur lettuce fresher longer and ready to use when needed.
