The purpose of these sessions, which began this month and continue through June, is to help SON members make an informed decision on the proposed Deep Geologic Repository (DGR) for low- and intermediate-level radioactive waste.

You may have already seen a letter from OPG's Chief Executive Officer, Jeff Lyash, who wrote to SON members last month, reaffirming our 2013 commitment that we will not proceed to build the DGR at the Bruce site without SON support.

As Jeff's letter stated, "OPG respects SON's rights and interests in its traditional territory, including your interest in preserving your physical and cultural heritage. We believe we share your values regarding good stewardship of the environment."
