It's Turtle Nesting Season!

From **late May to mid-July**, turtles are increasingly active. Females are searching for suitable nesting habitat to lay their eggs, and may be seen frequently on roads and roadsides - especially near wetland areas.



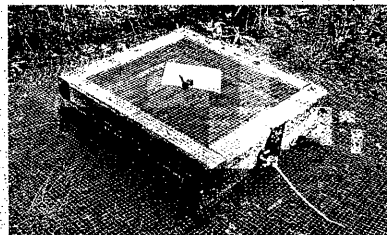
Helping turtles across the road

If you see a turtle on the road, help it across in the direction it was going if it is safe to do so. Painted turtles can be picked up like a sandwich. Snapping turtles are tricky to move, as they can reach their necks $\frac{3}{4}$ ths of the length of their shell. Use a shovel, paddle or car mat to help one across. You can also lift a snapper by the back and/or underside of its shell - but never by the tail.



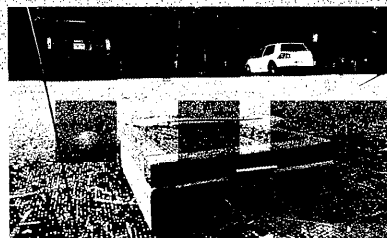
Spotting a nesting turtle

If you see a turtle in an area with sand and/or gravel (such as a roadside), it may be making a nest. Nesting turtles dig with their back two legs, and will appear as though they are "in a trance". Nesting turtles are easily disturbed. Please leave a wide amount of space between yourself and the turtle.



What's the wooden box on the side of the road?

Parks Canada is working with the SON community to build protective boxes for turtle nests.



Due to the impact of roads and a number of other threats, turtle populations are declining in our area and around the world. Turtle eggs are often dug up and eaten by predators such as raccoons and skunks. By installing protective boxes overtop of turtle nests, we can help increase the odds for hatchling turtles.

If you see one of these boxes on the roadside or out in the community, you'll know what it's there for!



Hatchling Turtles

In **late August and throughout September**, hatchling turtles begin to emerge. Turtles emerging from protective boxes will be able to escape through small slots in the frame. At this time of year, keep an eye out for hatchlings on roads and trails near wetlands.
