



- If you were removed from your home in Canada between January 1, 1951 and December 31, 1991 and placed in the care of non-Indigenous foster or adoptive parents.
- The settlement is for loss of Cultural Identity

If you or someone you know may qualify for the 60's Scoop Settlement you can have the Individual Payment Application for mailed to you. The Settlement Agreement has already been finalized. It is important to request this as soon as possible as the final date to apply is August 30, 2019.





Please join us for the third year of the Fabulous Festival of Fringe Film in Saugeen! Along with programming in Hanover and Durham, we have lots going on in Saugeen on Saturday, July 27th. This year we have commissioned an installation made with youth from the **Young Women's Group** and films that have involved multiple generations, from Elders to children. We are pleased to present the new documentary about Colten Boushie by Tasha Hubbard.

The Festival kicks off with premieres of three films made in the **Saugeen Takes on Film** workshop. They'll be featured at the Hanover Drive-In Theatre on July 18th and in Saugeen on July 27th. By animating archival photographs, artifacts, and traditional knowledge, the filmmakers tap into this vibrant community. Each film comes from a deeply personal place, sensitively navigating past trauma, ancestral presence and overcoming challenges. Friends and families of several generations are pictured in these films and bear witness to this moment in time. The films were made with hand-processing techniques that use flowers to replace chemicals, adding effects that look like abstract painting or mark-making. More importantly, the flowers have the potential to carry through teachings and healing properties of these plants into the material and subject matter of the film, and then onto the viewer. Following **Saugeen Takes on Films** are a series of **animated shorts and youth films** for the whole family selected from the National Film Board's collection of Indigenous-made films.

At 7pm we feature **Tasha Hubbard's, nipawistamasowin: We Will Stand Up**. On August 9, 2016, a young Cree man named Colten Boushie died from a gunshot to the back of his head after entering Gerald Stanley's rural property with his friends. The jury's subsequent acquittal of Stanley captured international attention, raising questions about racism embedded within Canada's legal system and propelling Colten's family to national and international stages in their pursuit of justice. Tasha Hubbard weaves a profound narrative encompassing the filmmaker's own adoption, the stark history of colonialism on the Prairies, and a transformative vision of a future where Indigenous children can live safely on their homelands.
